YOUTH MISSION TO HIGH-LEVEL POLITICAL FORUM (HLPF) – NEW YORK

In July, JISRA participated in the High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) in New York, championing youth inclusion in Freedom of Religion or Belief (FoRB) and broader peacebuilding efforts. Through impactful advocacy sessions, young leaders highlighted the essential role of youth in promoting tolerance and religious freedom on a global stage. ONLINE PHOTOVOICE TRAINING

In September, JISRA conducted a two-part Photovoice Training for our partners, focusing on using photography and storytelling to promote social change. Across both sessions, participants explored how Photovoice can capture powerful narratives that resonate in advocacy for FoRB, women's rights, and peacebuilding. The training provided a creative platform to develop visual storytelling skills, and we're excited to see how these tools will enhance campaigns like 16 Days of Activism and International Women's Day. CROSS-COUNTRY LEARNING WORKSHOP

From October 28 to 31, JISRA partners gathered in Mombasa for a cross-country learning workshop focused on strengthening knowledge-sharing and learning across borders. The workshop fostered a shared understanding of lessons learned, examined the promotion of women's and youth rights within FoRB, and engaged faith actors in peacebuilding efforts. Through hands-on sessions, including field visits and interactive discussions, participants developed skills in analysis, storytelling, and action planning. This collaborative experience equipped teams with tools to produce knowledge products and strategies that support sustainable advocacy and communication efforts within JISRA's mission.
